# 1. Focus efforts and investments on programs that strengthen primary care, behavioral health, and prevention.

KPI: A minimum of 90% of District program funds are focused on primary care, behavioral health and prevention. (Source: IRCHD) FY2022-23 Program Budget \$13,003,317 – 97.85% Primary Care – \$7,533,786 (57.01%) Programs and service are focused on the provision of integrated, accessible health care by clinicians who are accountable for addressing a large majority of personal health care needs, developing a sustained partnership with patients, and practicing in the context of family and community. Services include treatment, rehabilitation and palliative care, and are provided as close as feasible to people's everyday environment. (includes OB/GYN, Home Health/Hospice, Specialty Care, Dental and vision) Behavioral Health – \$3,551,216 (26.87%) Programs and services focused on the promotion of mental health, resilience and wellbeing, the treatment of mental and substance abuse disorders and the support of those who experience and/or are in recovery from these conditions, along with their families.

**Health Promotion and Disease Prevention – \$ 1,061,920 (8.03%)** Programs and services that enable people to increase control over their own health. They cover a wide range of social and environmental interventions designed to benefit and protect individuals' health and quality of life and reducing the development and severity of chronic diseases.

Other - \$1,069,442 (8.09%) Contributes to bettering the health of the community, provides outcome measures to substantiate and community healthcare related activity.

# 2. Improve access to healthcare services by reducing financial barriers.

KPI: maintain % of adults who could not see a doctor at least once in the past year due to cost below the state average. (Source: Florida CHARTS)

Enhance the Hospital District's Financial Assistance Database to capture other financial barriers than uninsured and Federal Poverty Level (FPL) and track new & return users in all categories. (Source: IRCHD)

District staff will advise District Trustees of convening strategies including action plans and timelines for each area as additional information is gathered and/or the areas becomes more critical.

## **2022**

Assist in building the continuum of care for Mental Health and Substance Abuse. Identify the district's role in recruiting and retaining professional healthcare providers. Help communication between provider to ensure greater access/follow through for specialty services.

Contribute to improving the bandwidth to allow at least 1 well visit/yr. for each member of the community.
